Name Bingo

Facilitators Notes

The purpose of the exercise is to encourage a new group to introduce themselves to each other, to find out some information about the other participants and to act as an energizer. The questions on the "Bingo" paper can be changed to suit the groups you are working with.

Each participant should be given a blank bingo sheet with a variety of questions; they should try and get a different name for each of the categories. (If there are less than fifteen participants this may be waived or you could say they must only use the first 5 names they gather once)

The first person to complete the card and call out "BINGO" is the winner. To make the exercise more interesting, the facilitator could split up the session by having the first vertical line as a winning point with a small prize, then resume play for two lines as the next marker, then a full house.

You can also alter the questions to suit the group to make it easier/more difficult.

This can be a very active game especially if the group is quiet large, so make sure people have enough space to move around.
