# SOURCES OF DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

Overall, <u>www.gov.scot/topics/statistics</u> and <u>www.isdscotland.org</u> are the most comprehensive sources.

NB. Scottish Neighbourhood Statistics is due to re-launch mid 2015 as a more comprehensive source of information, similar to the <u>www.data.gov.uk</u> concept.

## POPULATIONS

<u>www.sns.gov.uk</u> – best source for up to date population numbers, as well as breakdowns by age and sex, reported at a range of different areas – intermediate zones, wards, local authorities

<u>www.scotlandscensus.gov.uk</u> - census information about ages, gender, ethnic origin as well as household make-up and tenure. Comparisons with 2001 or at <u>www.scrol.gov.uk</u> http://www.scotland.gov.uk/Topics/Statistics/SIMD - detailed information on small area

populations (data zones)

www.nrscotland.gov.uk National Records of Scotland – different levels of population and demographic data

<u>www.gov.scot/topics/statistics</u> a range of official statistics covering a range of topics usually to local authority level.

www.ros.gov.uk/ Other national source of demographic information.

<u>www.hesa.ac.uk</u> A range of Higher Education statistics available to institution or local authority level.

<u>www.skillsdevelopmentscotland.co.uk</u> – information of post compulsory education and lifelong learning / school leaver destinations

<u>www.sfc.ac.uk</u> Scottish Funding Council provides a range of data on Scottish students studying in Scotland at higher and further education levels.

<u>www.scotpho.org</u> - best overall source of health information, including children and young people and maternal health – at National and Local Authority level for 2015. <u>www.scrol.gov.uk</u> - census information about health and carers (although now 10 years old) <u>www.sns.gov.uk</u> – area profiles include some health information, advanced reported gives additional health statistics as well as community care statistics including numbers and occupancy of care homes etc in a given area

www.scld.org.uk - data on adult learning disabilities in scotland.

<u>www.sustrans.org.uk</u> – HandsUp! Survey provides detail of active travel in Scotland. <u>www.isdscotland.org</u> - Information Service Division of NHS Scotland providing frequent outputs on all aspects of health. Usually available to Local Authority level or CHP level. Most comprehensive authority of health data.

www.isdscotland.org Includes the SALSUS survey of substance and alcohol use at school age.

### **UN / EMPLOYMENT**

<u>www.nomisweb.co.uk/</u>-up to date official labour market statistics. Includes data on employment, unemployment, qualifications, earnings, benefit claimants and businesses – although organised by pre-2007 ward areas / 2001 datazones.

<u>www.sns.gov.uk</u> – area profiles include some employment sills and training information <u>www.sqw.co.uk</u> - economic and social development research information available at varying levels.

<u>www.gov.uk/government/organisations/department-for-work-pensions</u> - UK government site providing statistics at various levels. UK-wide

www.gov.uk/government/organisations/hm-revenue-customs - UK government site as above, includes poverty/low income information at datazone level
